Landstuhl Hospital Care Project (LHCP) is a nonprofit organization that provides comfort and relief items for military service members who become sick, injured, or wounded from service in combat areas such as Iraq, Kuwait, and Afghanistan. Donated items are distributed to military patients at Landstuhl Regional Medical Center (LRMC) in Germany, the largest American military hospital outside the U.S., and to field hospitals in Afghanistan and Iraq. Many of the military personnel arrive with no extra clothing and require long hospitalization. The purpose of the program is to enhance the morale and welfare of the wounded by contributing quality of life items. Each shipment that LHCP sends is sent in honor of a military member who has made the ultimate sacrifice and lost his or her life in service to our country. Hospital staff report that when patients learn that they and their fallen service members are remembered "back home," spirits are lifted. As one nurse wrote in an e-mail, "It's a reminder that what we do is not in vain. It means a lot to the guys that are back there recovering — it helps them know they are not alone"
