"I think that the summer program is one the very important pieces of this grant," Dei said. "The challenge for us is to provide programs in the summer that are accessible to everyone in the community."

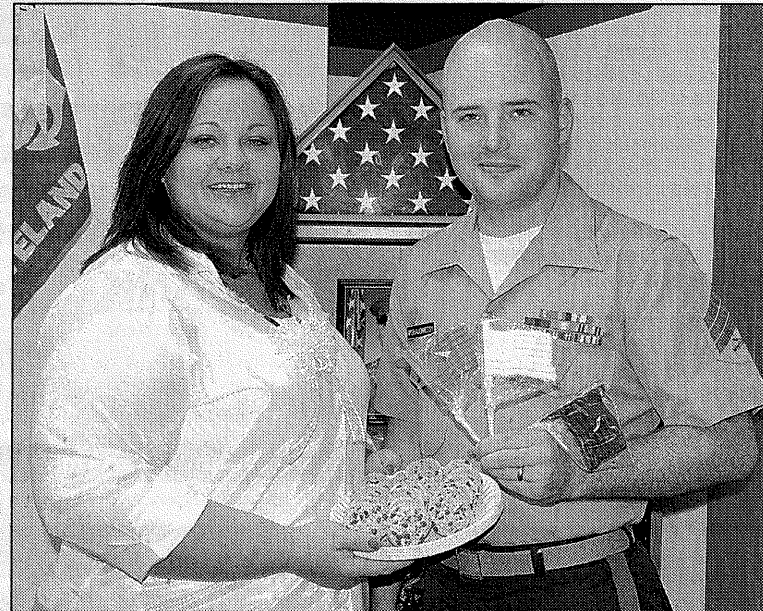
